

## Triathlon - Championnats du monde

### Kathy Tremblay 27<sup>e</sup> en Allemagne

**Kathy Tremblay** of Montréal ranked 27<sup>th</sup> place in the elite category at the World Championships, held in Hamburg, Germany, on Saturday. She crossed the finish line 4.31 minutes after the winner, Vanessa Fernandes of Portugal (1 h 53 min 27 s).

Australian Emma Snowsill and American Laura Bennett rounded out the top three.

Tremblay was the third fastest Canadian. Lauren Groves and Carolyn Murray, both from British Columbia, came in 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, respectively.

“Physically, I felt good. I thought I swam well this morning [Saturday],” said Tremblay. “But I started the bike in the third pack, which is not what I wanted. Our group was very fast, because we caught up with the second group. I still felt good at that time, despite my position.

When we started the run, we were one minute behind the lead pack. But the girls are doing the run in 34 minutes now, and that’s a time that I’m not yet able to do.”

The 25-year-old athlete ended up finishing the run in 36.27 minutes.

“Of course, this is not what I was expecting, but that good *feeling* was there, so now I just have to talk with my coach to see what adjustments I have to make to improve my ranking,” she added.
